Isleta	MEMORIALIZING PRESIDENT BIDEN AND INTERIOR SECRETARY HAALAND'S DECISION TO ADMINISTRATIVELY WITHDRAW PUBLIC
Jemez	LANDS FROM FUTURE MINERAL DEVELOPMENT IN 10-MILE WITHDRAWAL AREA SURROUNDING CHACO CULTURE NATIONAL
Laguna	HISTORICAL PARK
Nambe	WHEREAS, the All Pueblo Council of Governors is comprised of the New Mexico Pueblos of Acoma, Cochiti, Isleta, Jemez, Laguna, Nambe, Ohkay Owingeh, Picuris, Painessue, San Faline, San Ildefondo, Santa Ang, Santa Clere, Santa Domingo
Ohkay Owingeh	Pojoaque, San Felipe, San Ildefonso, Sandia, Santa Ana, Santa Clara, Santo Domingo, Taos, Tesuque, Zia and Zuni, and one Pueblo in Texas, Ysleta Del Sur, each having the sovereign authority to govern their own affairs;

Pojoaque	WHEREAS, the purpose of the All Pueblo Council of Governors is to advocate, foster, protect, and encourage the social, cultural, and traditional well-being of the Pueblo Nations;

San Felipe	WHEREAS , the 20 Pueblos possess governmental authority and sovereignty over their lands and sovereignty over the protection of their languages, cultures, and traditions;
San Ildefonso	WHEREAS, the Pueblos possess their own cultural territory and sovereign right to protect their cultural resources, including their traditional cultural properties and sacred sites, whether or not these cultural resources are located within each Pueblo's current
Santa Ana	exterior boundaries;
Santa Clara	WHEREAS, the Department of the Interior (DOI) leased approximately 91 percent of available federal lands in the Greater Chaco Region and has severely impacted
Santo Domingo	traditional cultural properties including sacred sites and other areas of significance to the cultural vitality, health, and wellbeing of the Pueblos and other Tribes;
Taos	WHEREAS, Chaco Culture National Historical Park and the Greater Chaco
Tesuque	Region is partially nestled within DOI's Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Farmington Field Office (FFO), and in 2012 DOI began undertaking efforts to amend its 2003 Resource Management Plan to account for new technologies in hydraulic fracking, among other
Ysleta del Sur	things, that could allow for even more development; and
Zia	WHEREAS, to mitigate any further harm to sacred sites and traditional cultural properties, the All Pueblo Council of Governors joined as a Cooperating Agency to the PLM EEQ's Resource Management Plan Amondment:

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Acoma Cochiti	WHEREAS, despite requests from the All Pueblo Council of Governors to DO and calls to halt oil and gas lease sales, DOI during that time continued to issue leases in the Greater Chaco Region, including the BLM FFO in January 2017 issuing leases of 84.
Isleta	areas of public lands for fracking activities within 19 miles of the Chaco Culture National Historical Park;
Jemez	WHEREAS, with the exception of a short time during the Trump Administration, DOI had in place an informal pause on new oil and gas leasing in the 10-mile area, and the Trump Administration eventually reinstituted this pause after calls from the Pueblos and
Laguna	other stakeholders to do so, and Congress eventually mandated a moratorium through it annual appropriations legislation;
Nambe	WHEREAS, the Pueblos and the Navajo Nation met government-to-government
Ohkay Owingeh	in 2017 to assess impacts of mineral development and seek opportunities to preserve the remaining approximate nine (9) percent of federal lands in the Greater Chaco Region, and
Picuris	over subsequent meetings and negotiations in 2018 the concept of the 10-mile withdraw area was borne;
Pojoaque	WHEREAS, over the years, the New Mexico Congressional Delegation and other stakeholders took steps to learn from the Pueblos and Tribes about their connections to
Sandia	Chaco Canyon and the Greater Chaco Region and the impacts of mineral development, including oil and gas leasing, on traditional cultural properties and the environment and the
San Felipe	health impacts of front-line communities;
San Ildefonso	WHEREAS , together the Pueblos, Navajo, and the New Mexico Congressional Delegation designed and advocated for the Chaco Cultural Heritage Area Protection Act,
Santa Ana	which would withdraw federal lands from new mineral development in the 10-mile withdrawal area while preserving the rights of Navajo and Navajo allottees to develop on their land;

Santo Domingo	WHEREAS, Navajo stepped away from its agreement with the Pueblos and its advocacy to Congress, changing its position from supporting a 10-mile withdrawal area to a 5-mile withdrawal area and then to no withdrawal;
Taos	WHEREAS, in 2019, the All Pueblo Council of Governors successfully advocated
Tesuque	for appropriations from Congress to DOI for disbursement to the Pueblos and other Tribes to initiate and develop a tribally-led cultural resource study of the Greater Chaco Region,
Ysleta del Sur	and the Pueblos have conducted this study through the Chaco Heritage Tribal Association comprised by the self-identified lead Pueblos of Acoma, Jemez, Laguna, and Zuni, and the Hopi Tribe, and the supporting Pueblos of San Felipe, Santa Clara, and Tesuque;

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Acoma Cochiti	WHEREAS , during the White House Tribal Nations Summit in November of 2021, President Biden announced that DOI would begin the administrative withdrawal consideration process for a 20-year withdrawal of public lands and minerals from future mineral development in the 10-mile withdrawal area;
Isleta Jemez	WHEREAS , dating back to January of 2020, the All Pueblo Council of Governors regularly submitted official correspondence to Navajo leadership to request a meeting to renew the relationship regarding Chaco protections but received no response;
Laguna	WHEREAS, finally after three years Navajo accepted an invitation from the Pueblos to meet government-to-government in May of 2023, allowing Pueblo Governors
Nambe	the opportunity to correct misinformation regarding the development and effects of the 10 mile withdrawal—clarifying that Navajo had helped develop the withdrawal and that it was
Ohkay Owingeh	designed to protect Navajo allottee development rights;
Picuris	WHEREAS, the All Pueblo Council of Governors has long maintained a nuanced and pragmatic two-part approach towards the protection of Chaco by: (1) advocating for withdrawal of federal lands and minerals from future mineral development in an especially
Pojoaque	critical 10-mile withdrawal area surrounding Chaco Culture National Historical Park a including its outliers; and (2) seeking tribally-led cultural resource studies and sufficient
Sandia	tribal consultation to proceed any development decisions, including oil and gas leasing, throughout the wider Greater Chaco Region;

San Ildefonso	WHEREAS, on June 2, 2023, DOI announced its decision to administratively withdrawal public lands from new mineral development in the 10-mile withdrawal area surrounding Chaco Culture National Historical Park for a 20-year term;
Santa Ana	WHEREAS, the Pueblos unequivocally celebrated this announcement, along with
Santa Clara	the New Mexico Congressional Delegation, many throughout Indian Country, and other stakeholders; and
Santo Domingo	WHEREAS , it is in the best interest of the All Pueblo Council of Governors to recognize the hard work of past and current Pueblo leadership and all stakeholders who
Taos	contributed to successfully advocating for the protection of Chaco Canyon, as DOI's announcement represents a major step forward in ensuring that all sacred landscapes are
Tesuque	protected.
Ysleta del Sur	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the All Pueblo Council of Governors firmly supports DOI's Chaco administrative withdrawal decision and recognizes President Biden, Secretary Haaland, their officials and staff, and tribal leadership and staff for their precedent-setting work to center traditional ecological knowledge and stewardship in protecting Chaco Canyon and the Greater Chaco Region;

Nambe	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , that the All Pueblo Council of Governors recognizes all Pueblo Governors for their commitment to fighting to preserve Chaco Canyon and the Greater Chaco Region;

Picuris	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , that the All Pueblo Council of Governors requests the Department of the Interior ensure unequivocal access to all public roads leading to the Chaco Cultural National Historical Park as well as ensure the safety of all visitors to the park.

Sandia	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED , that the All Pueblo Council of Governors commits to continuing its efforts to advocate for the protection of our sacred landscapes
San Felipe	and calls on all future generations of Pueblo leaders and people to reflect on this work, recognizing that this preservation of sacred landscapes serves as an example for future advocacy, ensuring that Pueblo languages, cultures, and traditions may always continue.
