## ALL PUEBLO COUNCIL OF GOVERNORS **RESOLUTION NO. APCG 2021-04**

## SUPPORTING THE 30 X 30 CAMPAIGN TO PROTECT 30 PERCENT OF U.S. LANDS AND INLAND WATERS AND 30 PERCENT OF U.S. OCEANS BY 2030

WHEREAS, the All Pueblo Council of Governors is comprised of the Pueblos of Acoma, Cochiti, Isleta, Jemez, Laguna, Nambe, Ohkay Owingeh, Picuris, Pojoaque, San Felipe, San Ildefonso, Sandia, Santa Ana, Santa Clara, Santo Domingo, Taos, Tesuque, Zia and Zuni, and one pueblo in Texas, Ysleta Del Sur, each having the sovereign authority to govern their own affairs;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the All Pueblo Council of Governors is to advocate, foster, protect, and encourage the social, cultural and traditional well-being of the Pueblo Ohkay Owingeh Nations:

WHEREAS, through their inherent and sovereign rights, the All Pueblo Council Picuris of Governors will promote the language, health, economic and natural resources, and educational advancement of all Pueblo people; Pojoaque

WHEREAS, the 20 Pueblos possess inherent government authority and Sandia sovereignty over their lands;

San Felipe **WHEREAS**, the Pueblos possess their own cultural territory and sovereign right to protect their cultural resources, including their traditional cultural properties and sacred San Ildefonso sites, whether or not these cultural resources are located within each Pueblo's current exterior boundaries:

WHEREAS, the protection of the Pueblos' cultural resources, including their traditional cultural properties and sacred sites, is necessary for our cultural survival; Santa Clara

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2021 President Biden issued Executive Order 14008 Santo Domingo titled "Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad" which calls on the Secretary of Interior in consult with head of other relevant agencies to produce a report recommending Taos steps the United States should take, working with State, local, Tribal, and other key stakeholders, to achieve the goal of conserving at least 30 percent of our lands and waters by 2030 ("30x30"); and Tesuque

WHEREAS, APCG continues to be a national leader across Indian Country in Ysleta Del Sur engaging in administrative, legislative, and legal efforts to secure permanent protections and preservation of tribal cultural resources, traditional cultural properties, and sacred Zia sites vital to the longevity of Pueblo cultural identity;

<b>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT</b> , the All Pueblo Council of Governors supports implementation of 30X30 to strengthen the government-to-	
government relationship, safeguard our environment, uphold trust obligations, and uphold Tribal sovereignty.	
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the All Pueblo Council of Governors	
support a national goal to conserve 30x30 and stand with U.S. Representative Deb Haaland (NM-01) and a diverse coalition of members of the U.S. House of Representatives as well as President Biden, state and local governments and other public,	
private and nonprofit partners in their efforts to reach that goal;	
<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> , that the All Pueblo Council of Governors calls on the U.S. government, Congress, and state and local leaders to significantly increase the tools and resources available to achieve locally-driven conservation, and to facilitate	
consultation, collaboration and good-faith conversations with Pueblo Nations, and among	
all Americans as we work together to achieve 30x30 and solve our nature and climate crises;	
<b>BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED</b> , that the inclusion of Bears Ears, the Greater Chaco Cultural Region, the Grand Staircase Escalante, and other Pueblo cultural	
landscapes are vitally important to the All Pueblo Council of Governors as eligible landscapes to achieve the 30x30 initiative.	
BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that the All Pueblo Council of Governors	
Chairman and his Designee(s) shall do all that is necessary to carry forward the intent of this Resolution.
